7. **Engage with Emerging Technologies:** Libraries should actively engage with emerging technologies such as artificial intelligence, machine learning, and virtual reality to enhance library services and user experiences. This includes exploring innovative applications of technology in research support, information retrieval, and digital scholarship, as well as providing training and resources to support digital literacy skills among library users.
8. **Advocate for Resources and Support:** Libraries should advocate for adequate resources and support to fulfill their mission effectively. This includes advocating for sufficient funding for collections, technology infrastructure, and professional development initiatives. Libraries should also collaborate with campus stakeholders and administration to raise awareness of the value and impact of library services on teaching, learning, and research outcomes.

By implementing these recommendations, central university libraries can enhance their role as essential hubs for learning, research, and innovation within academic institutions, and continue to serve the evolving needs of the academic community in the digital age.
